



## McCash research papers

1907-2008

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### Biographical Note:

June Hall McCash is a nonfiction writer and historical novelist who has authored and coauthored numerous works about Jekyll Island and its history. McCash holds a bachelor's degree from Agnes Scott College, a master's degree in French, and a Ph.D. in comparative literature from Emory University. For her novel *Plum Orchard*, she won the Georgia Author of the Year Award for best novel in 2013 as well as the Georgia Author of the Year Award for first novel in 2011 for *Almost to Eden*. Other novels by Dr. McCash include *A Titanic Love Story: Ida and Isidor Straus*, *The Boys of Shiloh*, *Marguerite's Landing*, *Eleanor's Daughter: A novel of Marie de Champagne*, and *The Truth Keepers*. Outside of Jekyll history, Dr. McCash has authored a book of poems, *The Thread Box*, and a book of medieval history, *The Cultural Patronage of Medieval Women*. Dr. McCash's nonfiction works have primarily revolved around Jekyll Island including *Jekyll Island's Early Years*, *The Jekyll Island Cottage Colony*, and *The Jekyll Island Club: Southern Haven for America's Millionaires*, which she coauthored along with her husband William B. McCash. Her most recent book nonfiction work on Jekyll was 2016's *Island Passages*. June Hall McCash currently lives in Tennessee with her son and continues to visit Jekyll Island.

### Scope and Content:

## **2012.001**

This was the first set of materials given by the McCashes' documenting their research related to Jekyll Island. This accession is comprised of a correspondence including handwritten letters and printed emails, personal notes. Other printed materials include postcards, photocopies of original publications, and documentation detailing the history of the Jekyll Island Club, as well as the lives of the members. Much of this accession focuses is on the Club members, their families, activities and stories from their stays on Jekyll, their finances, and their lives off Jekyll. Materials were primarily collected from 1965-2004.

There is also communication with organizations that contributed research materials to the McCashes' including a wide variety of libraries, newspapers, universities, historical societies, museums, archives, and social clubs.

Additionally, there is documentation detailing the construction of and interior decoration of the cottages the club members built to house their families during their time on Jekyll. There is also documentation detailing the earlier history of Jekyll Island such as the Wanderer, poetry written by enslaved people, genetic research conducted on the archaeological sites of Jekyll, and the genealogical studies of the families that have called Jekyll their home.

## **2013.001**

This accession is comprised of original black and white photographs dated to be from 1907-1958. Most of these photographs depict the club members and their family members both on Jekyll Island and off. The remaining images in the accession include a postcard of Ralph Beaver Strassburger and the Queen Anne, the scenery of Jekyll Island as the beach, the bike paths, the lawns of cottages, and the dock.

## **2020.014**

This accession is comprised of materials including photocopies, handwritten and emailed correspondence, photographs, postcards, advertisements, maps, newspaper articles, film slides and architectural plans. The focus of this accession is on Jekyll Island's Club Era, with significant research on the colonial and plantation periods of the Island. Other areas of research include Native American culture, the Wanderer, the lives of African American's, the history of the island as it relates to world events such as World War 2, and the State era of Jekyll. Primary sources from this accession were collected from 1975-2008.

The work is mainly geared towards telling the foundation of the Jekyll Island Club, stories of life on Jekyll for the club members and their families, the architecture of the clubhouse and the cottages, and the evolution the Island went through from the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> century to 1947 when Georgia bought the island. These stories are told using documents including membership rosters, photocopies of diaries and letters, and correspondence between June Hall McCash and various individuals and organizations.

Additionally, the history of Jekyll as a public state park is explored in newspaper articles, articles of renovations of historic spaces such as Mosaic, the Jekyll Island Museum, and how the structures on Jekyll have evolved since the island became a public state park. There is additional documentation depicting the history of the local area including the coastal counties of Georgia and North Florida.

## **2021.031**

This accession continues to document the work of June Hall McCash. Some material types include a film reel, a floppy disk, photocopies of documents, and correspondence both in writing and in email. The focus of this accession is on the colonial history, the Club era, and the descendants of the Jekyll Island Club. Research materials and correspondence related to Alex Gallion related to the Club Era members and their families is also in the collection.

There are a variety of resources relating to the Gould family with previously unpublished writings and research, drafts of "All that Glitters: The Legacy of Jay Gould" and copies of original primary source materials. Writer Richard Jay Hutto conducted research with Dr. June Hall McCash and is involved with chapter drafts, manuscripts, and correspondence being present in this accession. In addition to the book on Jay Gould there is also the research that influenced the writing, including the Gould family tree, articles elaborating on Jay Gould's ancestry and the lives of his descendants, and how the family has changed over the past century. Primary sources from this accession were collected from 1975-2008.

Additionally, there are photocopies, articles, and drafts discussing colonial and plantation history of Jekyll Island and the local areas. The focus of these sections is centered around key families that put roots down in the region including the DuBignon family, the Martin's, the Hyde's, the Horton's, the Struthers, and the Goodyear's. Genealogical documentation and family histories are also present for these families.

## **2022.026**

This accession is comprised of documentation detailing the state of Georgia's acquisition process of Jekyll Island in the late 1940's. Some materials include photocopies of newspaper clippings, documents, maps, and architectural plans. Materials deal with the Jekyll Island Club's resistance to the state's purchase of the island.

Sections of these materials are copies of original documents that relate to Sea Island managing Jekyll Island in the last years of the Club through the beginning of the state taking over management of Jekyll Island and establishing the Authority.

## **2023.008**

June Hall McCash acquired photos during her research into Jekyll Island Club members Goodyear, Macy, Maurice, Gould, Furness. These prints include images of the family, their homes, and Jekyll Island. These are relatively new prints of images dating from the 1880s-1940s.
